

What Do the Participants Say?

What does the SHALOM Woolery mean for you?

Karen: "It means that we get to do different kinds of things, and we get to meet people, and it's like a work site that has a lot of different people working together."

Kevin: "Meet new people, it's a challenge that I like and I really love this place. It's kind of like a gift to me and I meet new people that come and go and it's like a big, huge family together."

Jerry: "I love working with other people that are just like us and get to know how to teach them how to do other things just like us. I like teaching other people what I learned."

Diane: "Working on the loom and skirting the wool and ..."

Glenn: "Making friends. And believing in God."

Tommy: "To show other people how to make new stuff out of wool and stuff. Shalom family, it's a family."

Rose: "The Woolery means to me making friends, and also showing how we do things in the woolery like making hats, making the rugs, sewing, and also making new friends all along. And ah, showing how to do things."

Janelle: "I was blown away of how the Woolery is because when I came here to visit I was surprised at how well people were working and I just like the activities that we're doing. Surprised at how big it was and how nice it was. And I enjoy having you around, and I thank you for letting me to come here to work."

Denise: "Doing the wash. Ripping the cloth into balls so we can make the placemats and rugs."

Justin: "I go feed the animals, make sure they have food and water. And then play with the baby goats."

What do you like about the SHALOM Woolery?

Diane: "Make new friends. Working on the loom. Skirting wool."

Glenn: "Everything!" (Name three things!) "Looms, the people and going on the camping trips with you guys!"

Tommy: "My thing I like to do is, ah, help other people,

like new friends, like when people come in the door and to show them around. The tours, when people want to hear what we do at SHALOM family, here. Um, and then like show them how to make and pull little pieces off the wool and show them how to do it. Then to show them at the farm what, so they can see the animals, too."

Rose: "What I like about the woolery is just being there, and being happy for other people. If new people come in I like to show them around. And ah, slowly, each day, showing them how to do things. Karen: "Very passionate."

Kevin: "And overwhelmed."

Glenn: "Learning new stuff each day!"

Tommy: "It helps us look up to God. It just helps us, like the whole family just talk about things with God. I like being with friends. I like, help the coaches, and I like building stuff at the Woolery."

Rose: "I like sharing, and I like learning more about Jesus and what He did and in His life, the Bible, and

I like to just share so that my mind is wide open. And keeping the mindset of how Jesus did, He died on the cross and sacrificed to be, for us, and how to go on with our lives, and not

only that, it's like just completely being ourselves and have a Christian life together."
